

ABOUT THE HURRICANE RESPONSE HUB

The National Hurricane Response Hub (HRH) initiative is a coordinated effort among federal, state, and local public health organizations to facilitate training, technical assistance, and information sharing to enhance ongoing environmental and occupational health recovery in jurisdictions affected by the 2017 hurricanes. Through the HRH effort, professionals engaged in hurricane and disaster-related health recovery will have access to quality training and technical assistance through a network of five technical assistance centers representing the regions most affected by the 2017 hurricanes. The jurisdiction covered by the Georgia Hurricane Response Hub Technical Assistance Center (Georgia HRH) is the state of Georgia.



TRAINING

The Georgia HRH offers training to build public health workforce capacity in disaster-related surveillance, environmental health, and occupational health.



PARTNERS

The Georgia HRH partners with: Georgia Department of Public Health (DPH) and the Georgia Hospital Association (GHA). Together, DPH and GHA administer the Healthcare Preparedness Program (HPP), which helps regional healthcare coalitions repare for and respond to disasters and emergencies.

The Georgia HRH provides Technical assistance to individuals, organizations, and agencies recovering from the effects of 2017 Hurricanes Harvey, Irma, and Maria.
